FALLS PREVENTION AWARENESS DAY IN FLORIDA

WHEREAS, more than 19 percent of Florida's population is age 65 and older; and

WHEREAS, falls are the leading cause of fatal and non-fatal injuries among people age 65 and older in Florida, resulting in 2,817 deaths in 2017, 54,973 non-fatal hospitalizations in 2017, and 178,133 non-fatal emergency department visits in 2017; and

WHEREAS, injuries from falls are largely a preventable community health problem; and

WHEREAS, falls prevention education is a key first step to increasing public awareness regarding older adult falls prevention and home safety; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Elder Affairs, the Florida Department of Health, local fall prevention coalitions, and Area Agencies on Aging, in partnership with Florida communities and residents, are working to increase awareness of this issue and encourage Florida residents to take steps to protect those who are at risk of falling:
